- Green your plants
- Drawdown Carbon into the soil.
- Improve your property's drought resistance

Soil Blend Special Instructions - This is an actual soil like a farmer would find in their field; the right mix of sand, silt, clay and organic matter (our Compost). This is not a potting soil which has a fluffy, light airiness that can only be made with dead plant material (peat, coco coir, forest humus, etc.). We believe a real soil will perform better over the decades because it only improves with good gardening practice and never needs to be replaced.

If your soil came to you clumpy or dries hard, utilize mulch this season to help the soil relax by keeping it moist. Cover unused pile of soil to keep it moist and workable.

We are working to make our soil more pliable and believe we can make steady improvements for Spring 2023 and Spring 2024.

1) Topdress existing plants

Spread compost or soil blend around your vegetables, annuals, shrubs and perennials that are already planted.

Stay inches away from stems. Stay feet away from trunks.

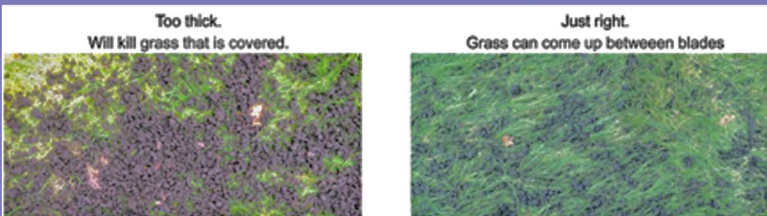
Spread between 1/2 to 2 inches thick. Anytime of year, but best in Spring and Fall.

2) Spread on Lawn

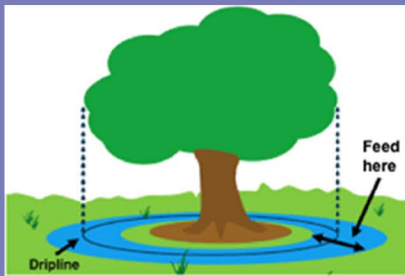
Dump small piles with wheel barrow. Disperse with a 'Spring Rake'.

Remove clumps by sending them under shrubs with the rake.

Let it rain-in twice before walking on this area.



3) Feed your Trees by returning compost directly to the tree's feeder roots.



Feeder roots are under the drip line. Often these roots are in competition with grass and have no leaves to feed on. Therefore, they need nutrients returned to stay healthy.

1. Use a ribbon or strap to mark out the center of the tree's dripline on the ground.
2. Spread compost on both sides of your line where you can. Skip walkways, pavement and where it would intersect with other tree trunks. In general keep compost at least a couple feet away from tree trunks.
3. Rake out with spring rake.
4. Let it rain-in twice (about 2 weeks) before walking there.

4) Annual Maintenance Compost June or Sept.

We are now delivering small, 1 cubic yard quantities to your home so you can do all 3 of these annual maintenances.

Our compost truck rolls through your neighborhood once in June and once in September.
